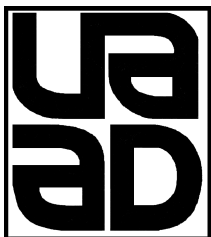

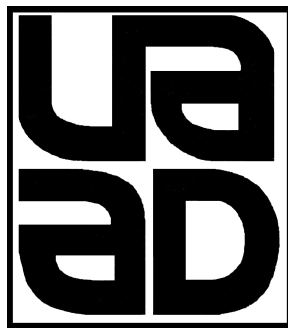

UAAD General Meeting

Wednesday, May 16, 2001 – Haymarket Park

President Duane Mohlman called the UAAD General Membership meeting to order at noon.

President's report

Duane Mohlman began by having members introduce guests who were with them for the meeting. He introduced his supervisor, Mark Kuzila, and thanked him for his support.

The finalists for UNL Police Chief have been interviewed. There should be an announcement of the new Chief approximately June 1.

Duane thanked the Executive Board and other committee representatives from this past year and had certificates made for each person. He then announced the Executive Board for 2001-02 including the newly elected officers: Julie Hagemeyer – Vice President/President-Elect; Vicki Fisher – Secretary; and Mike Carlson – Treasurer.

Chancellor's Commission on the Status of Women

Kandra Hanh commented that during the past year the Commission has supported tuition reimbursement for spouses and dependents and including prescription birth control in our benefits plan. They held a series of forums this spring to determine what it is like to be a woman at UNL. The results are currently being tabulated. (*Editor's note: Tuition reimbursement has since been adopted by the Board of Regents.*)

Treasurer's Report

The UAAD Foundation account balance is \$1,220. The UAAD checking account balance is \$641.04.

Summer Activities – Julie Hagemeyer:

This summer UAAD is sponsoring two 'UAAD Nights at the Rep.' UAAD members and their guests may purchase tickets to Jake's Women on Thursday, July 19 and/or ART on Thursday, July 26 for \$10, which is \$8 off the regular price. Both performances will conclude with a Meet-the-Cast Dessert and Coffee reception.

Recognition of Duane Mohlman's Service to UAAD

Edie Schleiger, UNOPA President, thanked Duane for his hard work and presented him with a certificate and a memento on behalf of UNOPA. Rosalee Swartz then thanked Duane for his outstanding year of service to UAAD on behalf of Jim Main who couldn't be at the meeting. Rosalee read comments from Jim regarding the high quality of leadership that Duane has provided to UAAD this past year. Rosalee presented Duane with a plaque of recognition.

Final Thoughts from Duane Mohlman

Duane thanked the board and other UAAD members who

helped him accomplish so much and enjoy this year so much. He encouraged everyone to become involved with UAAD because it is a fabulous organization where you can work with great people and learn a lot about the University.

Program/Speaker Introduction

Butch Hug introduced Joe Selig, Senior Associate Athletic Director at UNL, and Charlie Meyer, President of Lincoln Pro Baseball.

Joe Selig began by stating that a few years ago this project began as a vision of Jim Abel's. Ground was broken more than a year ago and are only a couple of weeks away from opening. The University put in a \$10.6 million investment and will get a baseball and softball complex better than we ever could have done on our own for 1/3 of the price.

The UNL Athletic Department is excited about the partnership and the progress and hopes to have a Super Regional baseball game at Haymarket Park. Enthusiasm for UNL baseball is certainly growing. In 1999-2000 there were 60 season tickets sold. This season 1,200 were sold, and they have already sold over 1,300 for next year, and that is without doing hardly any marketing.

Charlie Meyer started by saying this is an aggressive project that has gone extremely fast. They will be ready to hold a Salt Dogs game on June 1, but everything will not be done by that time. The winter was very tough for them, so they will continue to do landscaping throughout the summer. Currently there are approximately 200 people working on finishing the project. The stadium seats 4500 and there are also 16 sky suites. Eleven of the suites are given as part of corporate sponsorship packages and the other five are available for nightly rental. The sky suites each hold 20 people.

The Salt Dogs have approximately 60 season tickets left. There will also be tickets available on a nightly basis. The stadium holds three different concessions areas and a children's play area. This is truly a "park within a park" – there is wonderful access and you can walk around the whole area. The field is drained and heated so they will be able to play in February. It is the first ballpark in the United States with this system. Construction has started on the softball complex as well.

After a brief question and answer session, the meeting was adjourned at 12:40.

Association Survey results in

Did you know ...?

- 90.6 percent of managerial/professional employees responding to the employee survey conducted by UAAD last spring agreed or strongly agreed with the statement "Compared to other employment experiences, UNL offers me a satisfying job."

- 83.1 percent of respondents agreed or strongly agreed with the statement "I would recommend UNL as a place to work to my family and friends."

- on a scale of 1-5 (5 being very satisfied), 80 percent of respondents ranked the December campus shutdown a 3 or above.

- on a scale of 1-5, 61.9 percent of respondents ranked their satisfaction with athletic tickets a 3 or below.

These are just a few examples of statistics gathered from the UAAD Managerial/Professional Employee Survey conducted last spring. Overall it appears we are satisfied with our employment and there were no major

surprises in the primary things we aren't satisfied with—i.e. salary, wages, parking.

The data is now being analyzed and a written report will be produced. Stay tuned to the Update for more results from the survey.

Salary allocations

Representatives from UAAD and UNOPA met with members of the Human Resources staff earlier in August to discuss employee issues with regard to Human Resources. We discussed the pooling of managerial/professional and office/service salary allocations was one topic discussed (HR will put together a group to continue this discussion across the campus), and the revival of the New Employee Orientation Program by Human Resources and how UAAD and UNOPA can help. Information regarding each organization will be made available to new employees during the orientation process.
