

SCIP is located in nearly all Lincoln high schools, several middle schools and some elementary schools.

- SCIP exists to help youth and their families to address issues that may interfere with a student's school success. SCIP helps address issues such as mental health, bullying and/or substance abuse.
- SCIP offers free screening or evaluation at community agencies that work with SCIP

- SCIP's work allows school staff to teach and gives families the opportunity to have community professionals screen the students and make recommendations.

On March 22nd, SCIP is hosting a seminar "The Real Truth – The Impact of Bullying on our Youth". UAAD donations will help defray the costs of this seminar.
